The participating choirs and the joint singing of the German-. Canadian 'Sängergruss', followed by two introductory songs by the Harfentöne. Most choirs relied on a wide selection of folk songs. some of which, it must be said, were not suitable for the environment and the acoustics of the church. The Lyra Choir sang mostly German folksongs under the direction of Professor emeritus Alvin Reimer. Their new song, by Oscar Peterson, is called 'Hymn to Freedom', a moving piece of music expressing the longing for that all-too-often elusive freedom. A children's choir, associated with the German language school, sang several charming spring songs and comical songs, like 'Wir haben Hunger, Hunger, Hunger'.

The 35-man Valley View Male Choir under the direction of Henry Boldt offered a variety of songs from popular- to folksongs, a sea shanty, and sacred songs. 
