Last, but not least, only two more months to go.



At the special meeting held in January at the Germania Club. many items were brought forward regarding the future of our Club and furthering our German Culture and Heritage, and when it came to the history of the Skat Group which is an interest group on the club, the information was lacking. The following article is written to provide information how our little group impacts our community, on levels, Local, National and International.

In 1997 the social group which played SKAT moved to another location, and I was approached by Albert Kergl in an effort to try to bring some business into the club, to reintroduce the group. In the early days, we would at times attract 4 or 5 players, and we did try hard to draw more players in. Tony Grenc, who

was an ISPA Member in the Hansa Haus, recommended that our group would also apply for membership in the organization, which is the International SKAT Players Association. The requirement for our club to apply was a minimum of 12 members. Word was getting around that our group was growing and this generated interest. other clubs in the area played in the evening, the decision was made that Saturday afternoon would become a regular event, coinciding with the Rathskellar being open and it was not long before we were welcoming 10 to 15 players every week.

In the year 1999, we applied for and officially became members if ISPA. The impact for our Germania Club is that our group is recognized on an International Level. The yearly publication of the International SKAT Magazine contains a report on Germania Club of Hamilton SKAT group activities. If you would like to see this publication, there are two copies in the office for review. As well, the National ISPA Publication which is published quarterly


