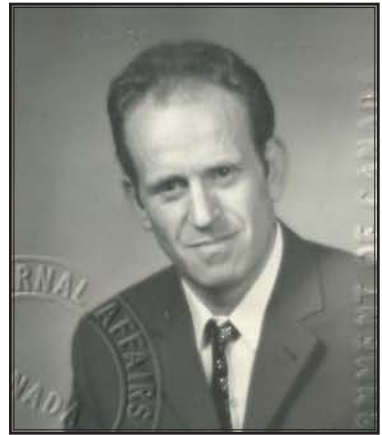

A loyal member for 50 years... Ernst Viebke, 1931 in Ueckermuende (Vorpommern) geboren und aufgewachsen.



Nach Abschluss seiner Lehre als Elektromaschinenbauer arbeitete er einige Jahre auf der Schiffswerft in Wismar. Das war zu DDR-Zeiten und viele junge Leute gingen damals nach dem Westen fuer einen besseren Lebensstandard. So fuhr er damals mit der S-Bahn nach West-Berlin, wo er in einem Auffangslager landete. Das war im Sommer 1954. Von dort fuehrte ihn sein Weg nach Stuttgart-Untertuerkheim, wo er in einem kleinen Betrieb in seinem Beruf arbeitete. Die Ironie wollte es, dass er einen Kollegen ersetzte, der nach Canada auswanderte. Er arbeitete dort ungefaehr ein Jahr, um dann ebenfalls nach Canada auszuwandern, (1955). Einen Tag nach seiner Ankunft in Hamilton hatte er seine erste Arbeit in der Hamilton Press Brick Co, (Ziegelei). Nach ein paar Monaten bekam er Arbeit im Westinghouse. Einige Jahre folgten in Elliot Lake in der Can-Met Mine, wo er als Elektriker beschaefigt war. Auf einer seiner Deutschland Reisen lernte er seine Frau Ruth kennen. 1959 heirateten sie in Hamilton. Die Familie vergroesserte sich um drei Soehne. Sie besuchten die Deutsche Sprachschule. Ernst arbeitete in den 1960er Jahren als Bartender im Deutschen Club, er gehoerte der Schach-Untergruppe an. Waehrend eines laengeren "Lay-Off-s" von International Harvester verkaufte er sein Haus und ging mit Sack und Pack zurueck nach Deutschland, wo er prompt einen Bauplatz kaufte, 9 Monate spaeter wieder verkaufte u. zurueck nach dem guten alten Hamilton ging. Das Glueck wollte es, dass Westinghouse eine offene Stelle fuer einen Elektromaschinenbauer hatte. Ernst arbeitete dort fuer ueber 25 Jahre. Auch nach seinem Retirement hatte er noch Assignments fuer Siemens - Westinghouse In Nord- u. Sued-Afrika sowie in Brasilien, Californien und Nevada.

The Camper's & Park Report



For better or worse, we all survived the ice storm of the century followed by the coldest temperatures ever recorded in our area. Kevin, our Park Manager, reported that there was no power for four days. However, as they say: "Every cloud has a silver lining." Though the ice storm did some damage to the trees, there is no apparent damage to our trailers. Also, the subsequent extremely cold weather should have killed all those pesky, hibernating insects, that normally come out at the first sign of warm weather to make our life miserable. As well, so Kevin tells me, the lake is frozen over solid. So if you feel you need a winter challenge, bundle up, put some cleats on your boots and hike across to find out what is happening on the other side.

It is in the January issue of the Germania Post that, according to the campers' rules, our camping fee should

be posted. Well, I had jumped the gun a bit and did it in December. However, here is a reminder.

The fees for the 2014 camping season;

Basic fee for a regular site, (sites 1 to 17, plus 34 to 35, plus C3 to C7) is \$560.00 Basic fee for a large site, (sites 18 to 31) is \$590.00. Trailers, less than 27 feet long, that sat on these large sites before 2011, with the same occupant, are grandfathered in at \$ 560:00. Air conditioner and extra fridge are \$ 40:00 each. Also, we are charged an extra levy of \$30.00 per campsite. This fee is designated for a special fund to be deposited into a separate account. This money is to be used only for major upgrades in the campground, most likely electrical. Now, remember, these are only the camping fees. Club membership fees are on top of it. Also, this \$30.00 levy should be paid separately; (a separate cheque perhaps). All prices include HST and should be paid before the end of February.

Only three months to go.

Everybody probably has a story to tell about Christmas 2013.

Maybe this could be a lead-in to our 150th anniversary. The early years could still be compared to pioneer times. Grandma or grandpa might have told a story of how one coped in 1914 and before, or how the first world war affected Germans that were already in Canada. I only came in 1967, full of enthusiasm about this new country. The war was only over for a bit more than 20 years, and we did not realize

how much resentment still existed by Canadians vs. Germans... Thank God, time heals many wounds.

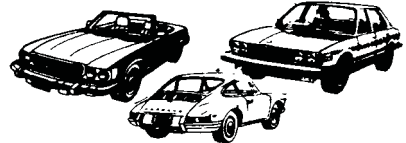

April 2, 1924 – December 28, 2013

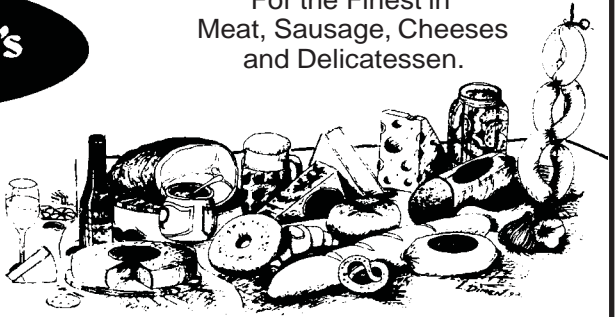
