By the time you read this article, the 150th anniversary celebrations will have come and gone. A full report of all the festivities will appear in the July edition of the Germania Post.

We should also acknowledge all the hard work of the Planning Committee and the countless volunteers, who are involved in the preparations for the events. The Committee consisted of Hedda Wagenblast, David Simon, Betty Boerkamp, Netty De-Wit, Ingrid Oppermann and Inge Leitner, with great help from George and Nina Fischer.. The logistics of realizing a three-day event of this magnitude are quite daunting, considering the great number of visiting choirs.

The proceedings started off with a gala on Satur-May 17th. This was day. followed by the 150th Anniversary Concert and a dinner on May 18th. Finally, the festivities wrapped up with a farewell brunch at the Club on May 19th. In preparation for the events, accommodations and bus services had to be booked; gift packages with information booklets, individual name tags, an anniversary publication and assembled; concert more, tickets sold; donations and advertisements procured; meals planned; serving staff and clean-up crew volunteers found; the Club hall spruced up; the concert venue set up and cleaned up afterwards,



etc... Kudos and our deep appreciation go to all of you involved, in both the forefront and behind the scenes.

Honourable mention also goes to Susan Butz, who organized the Club's Easter Egg Hunt at the Germania Park, on April 19th. Jeanet Schaefer was a popular and cuddly Easter bunny for the youngsters. Live music was provided by Arthur Wagenblast, Ingrid Oppermann and Karl Uschold, and mother nature was kind to the easter egg hunters.

The other important happening, was the spring garage sale of the Germania Choirs. It took place on Saturday April 26th. Hedda, Arthur and I arrived at the Germania Club at 6 am. 
