

Some died, some were too close to Hydro lines, and one made it impossible to move RVs safely on and off that campsite. So in the dying days of October, Kevin, Frank and Ken sharpened their chainsaws and with the help of some camper volunteers, went to work. Hank, (the keeper of the fire), Jeannie, Jeanette, Liz; the Fletcher family, Dennis, Karrla, Bobby, Denny and Crissy. Felling trees is hard work and we campers thank you all.

#### More News:

Kevin has informed me that at some sites, where RVs were previously parked in a row (in line), new arrivals will have to be positioned parallel to each other. Site #11, #12 and #14 are unoccupied right now so that changeover should be easy. Existing units are grandfathered in for now. There are two reasons for this: Much easier maneuverability moving RVs in and out. Also many insurance companies require a minimum distance of fifteen feet between units to provide coverage. Repositioning RVs this way will accomplish that.

Our Thanksgiving pot-luckdinner was a blast! What started out as a small family affair, blossomed into a happy free-for-all. The variety of foods was amazing. Thank you Debbie and Blain




