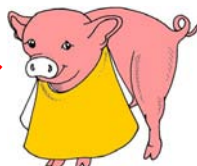

If you did not have a chance to celebrate Oktoberfest, “auf der Wies’n” in Munich, your next best bet would have been the Germania Club celebration right here in the heart of Steel City. The Banquet Hall was festively decorated in the traditional blue and white Bavarian colours. Two lions, hoisting enormous steins of beer, stood guard over the proceedings. As well, on either side of the stage were placed posters with all of the names of our generous “Community Partners”. The signs and banners the Partners had supplied were also fastened to the outside of the upstairs balconies, or wherever it was felt, they displayed most effectively. The colourful dirndls and German ethnic garb in evidence certainly evoked an authentic German Oktoberfest atmosphere. Towards early evening, the Banquet Hall started to fill quickly, and extra tables were set up to accommodate large groups of youthful revellers. Shortly after 6:00pm, Twin City Alpine Echo took to the stage. Their Oktoberfest rhythms had the place hopping for the rest of the evening. It was a pleasure to see the large number of young people that came out to enjoy the festivities. All of us involved in putting the event together were delighted that so many of our members attended the festivities as well. The evening was filled with a variety of entertaining and thoroughly enjoyable activities and performances, all managed with flair by our own Eva Kolwes. Matthew Green, the Ward 3 City Councillor, graciously stepped in for Mayor Fred Eisenberger, who was abroad, for the tapping of the keg, which was accomplished with panache by Edi Keller. Ulli Venohr and Matthew Green were the first to hoist their glasses before everyone else descended with their own, on the free keg of beer. The Narragonia dancers were with us once again this year, and added to the lively atmosphere with their colourful costumes and their spirited dance numbers, they performed during the course of the evening. Without any doubt, “Bier stemmen” is one of the more popular Oktoberfest activities, usually enjoyed by the younger generation of either sex at our Club. Let us just mention here, that the youngsters squared off against one of our more “seasoned” Club members, Karl Uschold. Karl made it into the second round. The young man squaring off against him in the final, later remarked that when his strength started to desert him, he looked into Karl’s eyes and knew he could not win. Karl Uschold was the winner.
