The President's Corner



Dear Members,

Let me begin with a warm thank you, for electing me to the position of President of the Germania Club.

Most of you know me by now. I first became a member of the Germania Club in 1992, and joined the Board as Second Treasurer in 2011. That term was extended for a further year, for the 150th anniversary celebrations. As well, being named, Member of the Year at the 2014 Stiftungsfest, and receiving a standing ovation, meant to me, that you acknowledged the hard work the Board was doing on your behalf. This fact played a big part in my decision to stand for the position of President.

It is expected, that the mandate of the Board that you elected, is going to be very challenging, as several key positions on the Board remain vacant. They include the positions of First and Second Social Directors; the Public Relations Director; and that of Second Secretary. It was disappointing to many of us, that such a small number of individu-

als were willing to run in this year's election. The last Board was already in the unenviable position, that in the absence of a Household and Events Committee, they not only had to plan all of the events, but also to execute those plans. This was accomplished with the same small group of loyal volunteers. Now the Board is even smaller.

In 2014, most of the Board's energy was spent on planning events for the 150th anniversary celebrations. 2015/16 will have to become the year, where we will have to define the future of the Germania Club. We have to answer the difficult questions, that with a declining attendance at functions, and an aging membership, do you still want a Germania Club? Are we from now on willing, to simply rely on income generated by events from hall rentals to outside organizations? I know these are difficult questions to hear, because many of you have spent decades being members, and enjoying the events and activities the Club had to offer.

Nevertheless, I promise you, that the Board will do its utmost to meet the coming challenges, but we need you, the Membership to support us in this endeavour. A few use-

Each year, the Germania Choirs celebrate, "All Choirs Night". This year it was held on Saturday, March 21st. For one evening, we invite choirs from the Hamilton area for a lively evening of song. This year we featured a dance troupe as well. When the program was compiled, we knew it was going to be fun. We just didn't know it was going to be this much fun.

The doors opened at 4:30 pm. The Great Hall was filled in no time and everyone wanted to eat dinner. Tons of schnitzel, sausages, smoked pork

hocks, sauerkraut, potatoes and strudel were consumed, and the bar was doing brisk business.

Hedda Wagenblast opened the proceedings with some warm welcoming remarks, and Sergeant Michelle Hostovsky of the Hamilton Female Police Choir briefly talked about, "Project concern". There was no admission charged for the concert. However, donations were accepted. We are proud to report, that over \$800 were collected for this project, that targets families and youth, in the Hamilton area.

The Germania Choirs, under the direction of Linus Press, and with Clement Ng on piano, started the musical portion of the evening with the exuberant march, "Musik, Musik, Musik (Wien bleibt Wien)". This was followed by the more reflective, "An den Frieden", celebrating universal brotherhood and peace. The police choirs were the first visiting choirs on the program, since some of their members were scheduled for active duty later that evening. Both the performances of the Hamilton Male Police Chorus, and the Hamilton Female Police Choirs were

lively, and imbued with good-natured humour, that added much to the lightheartedness of the evening. As a complete change of pace, the Hula-Wahines (Dancing Women), an over the age of 55 Hawaiian dance troupe from Hamilton, took to the stage, not once but twice during the evening, to the great delight of the audience. The North Hamilton Community Health Centre Choir, was a late entry, and thus not listed in the program. The choir members were COPD (chronic obstructive pulmonary disease) patients of the Centre and presented the song, "Breathe". The melody was that of the Everly Brothers' hit song, "Dreams". All of the audience was deeply moved by the courageous performance.

After the intermission, both the female and mixed West Plains United Church Choirs of Burlington performed a number of lively songs. The medley from, "Sister Act", was especially enjoyed by the audience. The Hula-Wahines wowed us one more time, and then the Classic Blend Barbershop Chorus took to the stage. The choir has been competing and captivating

audiences with their lively and highly energetic performances since 1964, and it was not any different tonight.

Then it was time for the Germania Choirs' closing performance. We began with the joyous, "Lobt den Herrn der Welt" and, "Gloria" from Mari-azeller Messe, then closed with the solemn, "Frieden" and finally, "Neigen sich die Stunden". Linus sensed the party mood of the audience and offered, "Das Bierlied" as an encore. The audience was only too happy to follow suit, when the choir started to "schunkeln". If you could not join us this year, perhaps you can do so at, "All Choirs Night 2016". See you then.

One last reminder: Spring meeting and elections on Sunday, the 17th of May at 1:00 pm.


Spring clean-up Saturday, the 30th of May at 10:am.
