

In 1998, he retired from Westinghouse, where he worked in maintenance for 25 years. In 1958, Waldemar bought land on Riley Lake, in the Muskokas, and started building a cottage, where he spent many happy years. His nephew is taking care of it now.

While still in Toronto, Waldemar was a member of the Harmony Club for 10 years. In 1965, Waldemar moved to Hamilton and joined the Germania Club. There he met Katharine Wahrlich in 2002. Together they became involved in Club activities, and looked after the Sunday night dances for 2 years, starting around 2006. Waldemar has travelled all over Canada, but now lives a quiet life together with Katharine. He looks back at a very full and interesting life. The Camper's & Park Report



It just doesn't seem fair that so soon after Christmas we are being reminded that our camping fees are coming due. But rules are rules and section 6.2 in our book of "Rules and Regulations," does stipulate: "The fees for the coming season are to be published in the January edition of the Germania Post." They are due before the first of March. So here, my fellow campers, are the numbers for the 2016 season:

A regular RV site: \$635.00.

Large RV site: \$665.00

Air Conditioning: \$40.00

Second Refrigerator: \$40.00

Any battery powered vehicle: \$40.00

Campground improvement fee: \$30.00 (to be paid with cash or by cheque separately). Club membership fees, which are due at the end of January:

Student: \$22.00,

Adult: \$75.00

Senior: \$55.00

Family: \$130.00

The following have no water or electrical services.

Daily camping: \$15.00

Weekend camping: \$25.00

Weekly camping: \$40.00

Monthly camping: \$70.00

Seasonal camping: \$420.00

Overnight guests: the charge is \$5.00 per night per guest, but the first one is free.

Daily, up to eight daytime visitors are free. Any more, the charge is \$2.00 per person per day.

Please, also be reminded that the lock on the main gate has been changed. If you feel you have to check on your RV during the winter, you will have to park on the street and walk in. Also, after talking to Kevin, sites C 2 to C 7, as well as sites #9 to #14 are now deemed large sites and charged accordingly. Any new trailers will be parked parallel to each other on these sites, (not in a row). Present campers are grandfathered in.

Our next camper's meeting is tentatively scheduled for the 22nd of May in the Pavilion, at 1:00 pm.

and deeply moving “Sanctus”. The Choirs then completed their presentation with, “Lobt den Herrn der Welt”, and “Freunde lasst uns singen”.

Hannelore Simon rose to lead the assembly in offering Grace, before the formal sit-down dinner. Everyone lingered over dinner somewhat longer than the program anticipated. However, Chef Ray Osborne appeared and accepted the applause for the excellent entrée of Rouladen, chicken breast, mixed vegetables and mashed potatoes that had been served. Once the coffee and a delicious Torten dessert had been served, the proceedings continued.

After the introduction of the new Board of Directors, and supporting groups, the subgroups one by one, rose to make their presentations. These usually take the form of a donation and symbolize the allegiance and support of the subgroups to the umbrella organization, the Germania Club.
