

Werner Grote biography: 50 year Germania Club membership celebration, 2017.

Werner was born on the 14th of June, 1943 in Spahn, Niedersachsen, Germany. He attended public school from 1949 until 1957, and after that completed a three year apprenticeship for electrician. He met his wife Agnes at the school where he studied for his apprenticeship. Agnes was studying sales at the same school.

In 1961 he joined the Bundeswehr. Agnes and Werner were engaged in 1963, before she went to Canada to be with her sister. Werner joined her in



1965. He arrived on the boat "Arcadia". Agnes was waiting for him in Quebec City. They then came to Hamilton.

They got married, 1966 in St. Boniface Church in Hamilton. Werner became a member of the Germania Club and the Fishers & Hunters in 1967, where he helped build the rifle range the same year.

After his arrival by boat, he worked for John Hepperle for one year, and after that for West Hamilton Electric, until he started his own business in 1971, "Grote Electric". Since his electrician licence was not recognised in Canada, he made his journeyman license all over again in 1966 and a master license in 1971.

Werner and Agnes were blessed with three children, Elisabeth, Andy, Mariejane and three grandchildren. Sadly Agnes passed away in 2004. After a few more years, in 2007, Werner retired and now enjoys his retirement on Haldibrook Road in Caledonia. His daughter lives next door.

Agnes and Werner were passionate Hummel figurines collectors. Since the passing of Agnes, Werner enjoys continuing the family tradition.

Werner still visits Germany as often as he can. We hope he will be able to enjoy the Germania Club for many more years to come.

Check your Germania Post please. There are a number




of interesting events coming up (Choir Winefest, Memorial in the Park to name only a few..)
