l was so surprised at my birth, l couldn't talk for a year and a half.



A Brief History of the Germania Club by Hans Bastel

It was the profit from the Fischer Hotel dances, combined with low interest debenture loans from Club members, that provided the funds for the many property acquisitions after 1950. Many of you are likely aware of these purchases and expansion projects.

In 1952: The original duplex

on 863 King Street East was purchased.

In 1955: The large hall was constructed. Also, in 1955, the parking lot in the back of the building

was purchased from a Lawn Bowling Club.

In 1960: The 48-acre Germania Park was acquired.

In 1961: The cottage property up north was purchased.

In 1962: This building was greatly expanded in the front and on the 2nd floor.

Finally, in 1976: The Germania Park house was acquired.

The total cost of all these purchases amounted to around \$300,000. Not a bad investment when one considers the following:

• When the cottage property was sold last year, it yielded \$385,000!

• For tax purposes, the Germania Park is assessed at \$250,000. It is worth considerably more.

• Again, for tax purposes, this

building on King Street East is assessed at around \$700,000. Depending on what happens with the LRT project, it too, could be worth an awful lot more!

The above numbers describe the post- World War II material facts. What they don't tell, are the stories and efforts of hundreds of Club members who have invested thousands of unpaid hours of work in the Club. They have worked, and are still working, their proverbial butts off to make this place a "home away from home" for its members and guests – and to make it a Hamilton focal point for German culture and traditions.





One of the best ways to illustrate this accomplishment, is to list – in no particular order – the large number of interest and activity groups which have existed in our Club since the 1950's:

Quite a page full! At times, this place was operating from morning to night, seven days a week.

It is worth mentioning that many interest groups had their own sub-groups. For example, the Fishers and Hunters did not only fish and hunt, they also had a target shooting group operating out of the Germania



Park. The Gymnastics Club had sub-groups for children, youth, men, women and elite athletes. One of its members, Steve Mitruk, made it into Canada's Olympic team, while others won Canadian and Ontario championships.

All of the above cost money, lots of money. The interest groups needed budget funds, Club operations required funds, construction projects and building maintenance needed, and still need, to be financed. Where

did all that money come from? Essentially, from four sources:

1. Membership fees

 Club dance admission fees
Banquet Centre profits, and
Low interest, member-held debenture loans.
But things have changed considerably during the past 30 to 40 years!

Immigration

from German-speakers in Europe has virtually stopped.

• There have also been major societal changes: The gen-

erations of our children and grand-children have largely lost interest in joining volunteer driven social and cultural organizations. This does not only affect us and other ethnic groups. It is a general trend. Just look at the shrinking memberships of Rotary Clubs, the Shriners, Lions Clubs. churches and choirs. This is happening not only here in Canada, but seemingly throughout the western world.

My remarks today were intend-

ed to deal with the history of the Ger-Club. not mania about its present or its future. But before finishing, allow me to make a personal observation. This observation is based on a discussion I had many years ago with two elders of our Club, past Presidents George Martini and August Fischl, both of whom had joined the Club before World War II.

The two of them pointed out, that when one looks at the history of the Club - right back to 1864, one will notice a common

theme, they used the German expression "roter Faden". This common theme, this "roter Faden", is the close linkage between the Club as a whole and its choir. As long as there is going to be a choir, there is going to be a Germania Club, they stressed.

The fate of our choir is a bell-weather, an indicator, for the fate of the Club as a whole. Other clubs may have other bell-weathers, but for us, it is our choir!

In this context, and before closing my remarks, I would like to read a very short German poem by Hans Mueller, a longago choir conductor in Southwest Africa:

Was uns eint im fremden Land,

Was uns hält, ein festes Band, Heilig durch die Seele zieht, Das ist unser deutsches Lied!
