

could open the Club safely to our aging and therefore, as we know, vulnerable segment of the population to the ravages of the corona virus. The Board knew that we needed to ensure that all government protocols with regard to sanitizing, mask-wearing, social-distancing and contact tracing had to be strictly observed.

The Board and all its volunteers worked very hard to put all the mechanisms in place to ensure that the get-togethers were safe for our membership. You let us know how much you missed human contact and we tried to be sensitive to the mental health issues that can arise from prolonged isolation.

We were able to determine fairly quickly that smaller events were easier to control than those with more attendance. We also became more concerned as that first week of events unfolded that not all attendees were following the protocols imposed by the government. I think all of us are aware of all the protocols. We are bombarded with them on a daily basis. Wearing a facial mask under the nose is not proper protocol. Mingling with less than 2 metres distance without a facial mask is not proper protocol if you are not part of a bubble.

The Board can only do so much, the rest is up to you. So we ask that for any future Club events, you wear your mask properly if you can, when required, because you see, the other person wearing the mask is protecting "you" but if you don't wear yours, then you are not protecting them. We are asking you to practice some neighbourly love if you are not part of a bubble, even if it goes against your personal conviction that we are over-blowing the problem or in some cases, that it is non-existent. Keeping in mind the rising numbers for COVID-19 infections, the Board has to rethink the approach to the re-opening. We may have to curtail larger events for the time being.

Just one more thing. Our President from the beginning advised to err on the side of caution and postpone a re-opening. We certainly did not take his advice lightly, however, as a Board we relented to countless requests from our membership to at least try to have some have some events. It was summer and both of the larger events were held outside. We do care about the mental health of our members. We are social beings and crave human interaction. We are still hopeful that we can proceed with our smaller events as fall and winter approach.



On Saturday, September 12th, after several days of unpredictable cool, rainy, and cloudy weather, our President Hedda, picked the perfect day to organize our annual choir picnic in and around the Fisher and Hunter Hall at the Germania Park.
