





TREASURER'S UPDATE.....

Dear members,


As we are starting in our 2nd year of the coronavirus pandemic, I thought I should give you a bit of a report of how we are doing financially. Since we will most likely not have an annual general meeting anytime soon, the board will be preparing a report to send to all members. This of course will contain the year end financial statements for you to review.

In the meantime, as you can imagine our income was dramatically reduced but our expenses, at least many of them continued. Expenses such as insurance, taxes, maintenance, heat and hydro, some wages, all normal park expenses and many day-to-day expenses at the club house. This left us with the deficit for the year. To combat that, I applied for and we received the \$40,000 CEBA (Canada emergency bank account), which we need to pay back by December 31st 2022. If we pay the loan back by this date, \$10,000 of the loan is forgiveable. I have set it so that we make monthly payments, that will pay off the \$30,000 by December 31st 2022.

The next item we applied for was

the Ontario small business grant, which could have given us between \$10,000 and \$20,000. In the end we received \$14,996, and this amount does not need to be repaid it is a grant. Both the federal and provincial monies in this case can only be used for non deferrable expenses, and not elective purchases.

Finally I also applied for the Canada emergency wage subsidy CEWS, and we are receiving that percentage of wages which we have paid starting in August. The amount for 2020 is approximately \$3400.

Hello fellow Campers,



Soon it will be spring and with the recent provincial lockdown many campers must be looking forward to the upcoming camping season!

Our Park Manager Ken Foebel has been to the park over the winter to survey the park & sites for any damages.

One important note to mention is the Board of the Germania Club has approved the new 2021 rules and regulations of the campgrounds. These new rules will be handed out at the annual May Campers meeting and Campers Executive board election.

Further, all campers will now be required to have a honey wagon for all wastewater (sewer & grey water). Despite anything a previous Chairman or Park Manager may have indicated in the past, it is an offense to the Conservation Authority rules to discharge any wastewater onto the ground. In addition, Provincial guidelines may order any beach or park to lock washroom facilities at any given time in 2021. Therefore it is imperative that all campers have honey wagons.

The annual May Campers meeting, and Campers Board Election will be held on Saturday May 8, 2021 at 1:00 pm in the Fisher & Hunter building if provincial guidelines permit. If provincial guidelines do not permit, we may need to schedule a zoom meeting at a later date.

Wishing everyone good health and please remember to stay safe for the benefit of all.
