

Just Pondering..

You may remember that several years ago we had a guest speaker at the Germania Club by the name of Manfred von Vulte. Manfred was the author of a book called "Where have all the Toronto Germans gone?". As von Vulte put it, "Although, for some time Germans were reported to be the third largest ethnic group in Canada and the first in the United states;the German-Canadians have staged the most impressive disappearing act of the 20th century by a staggering amount of people in Canada."

I found his book and his presentation to the Club interesting, and intriguing. The 'disappearing act', as he describes it, is actually a melting into the fabric of the Canadian population. Sharing the German heritage but not in too obvious of a way, so as to stick out, on a daily basis. "Keep your head down, and work hard."

The attractiveness of Canada as a whole, has made it a great place for people to settle and prosper. Germans, no matter how they came to Canada, whether as direct immigrants, many from virtually every east European country, or through the U.S., such as the Pennsylvania Dutch [Deutsch] found Canada a place to come to. We all know of the settlements in the Waterloo area, out in Manitoba and Saskatchewan, Quebec and New Brunswick. Many German immigrants went to Alberta and BC.

Towns and streets were named after many of the founders and where they came from like Berlin (now Kitchener), Mannheim (now Markham). Some communities still remain with their names like New Hamburg, and German Mills, and Steinbach to name a few.

Why do I bring this up, you might ask? I was recently doing some work on the topic of the future of the Germania Club. and discovered some interesting statistics. Did you know that in 1871 the number of people that claimed to be of German heritage, meaning they had either one or both sides of their family German was approximately 203,000 people or roughly 5.8% of the Canadian population. By 1941 Canada had 464,682 German-Canadians or about 4% of the population, by 1961 it was 1,049,599 people or about 5.75% (almost back to the 1871 ratio).

You will most likely be surprised to learn, that in 2016 Canada had 3,322,405 people who indicate that they are German-Canadian or about 9.6% of the entire population.

In Hamilton, in particular, in the 2016 census, just over 50,000 people

Mind you, my Challah Bread

never turned out evenly plump and glossy like Mama's.

Those were simpler times, but I still have very fond memories of the joy we experienced at these modest, but special Mother's Day moments in my childhood.

The evening before this year's Mother's Day, we will be helping the members of the Austrian Club celebrate a Mother's Day Dance on their premises. We have been asked to sing a few numbers immediately after dinner, before the actual dancing starts.

The following Saturday, we are hosting the biannual DKSB (Deutsch-Kanadischer-Saengerbund) meeting, which will be followed by our Spring Singalong, to which all the choirs and Germania Club members have been invited.

On Friday, June 2nd, we will be giving our annual Spring Concert at Highgate Retirement Home, and on June 11th we will participate in a Singalong Concert at the Kitchener Concordia Club in honour of that choir's 150th Anniversary.

Our choir has donated \$1,000 toward a Scholarship Fund for students taking part in a Music Fest in May, of which our conductor is one of the organizers. Roland thanked us very graciously for our support of young talents toward the study of

music.

Now that the weather is finally more conducive to outdoor activities, we are making concrete plans for our annual choir picnic at the Germania Park. I believe Eckhard and Roland are already getting their BBQ aprons ready for the big event. More about that in the next Germania Post.

have German heritage which is just over 10%, higher than the Ontario and Canada averages. Getting more specific, Ward 3, where the downtown Club is located has 4,000 people who have German heritage, in fact that is more people than that claim Italian heritage. Ward 11 where the Germania Park is, has 2,875 people of German heritage.

The largest percentage of the population being of German heritage is in Saskatchewan at 27.7%!


I have been pondering for years, why
