





In 2007, Canada had 69 successful athletes, 56 of them from the Hamilton-Toronto region. Worldwide, for 2007, 947,535 Sportabzeichen where handed out. Participants are between 15 and 90 years of age, Male & Female. Next time you see me in the Club ask me about it.

In 1976, Benjamin Sinclair Johnson was just a skinny immigrant kid struggling to make his high school track team. A decade later, he was a destroyer of world records, the "world's fastest man." Ben set a world record (9.83 seconds) in the 100-metre sprint at the 1987 world championships in Rome. He smashed the old record by a tenth of a second, a feat so dramatic it fueled speculation about drug use. Johnson received the Order of Canada and was named Canada's athlete of the year.

Is that enough? You can't go far talking about Ben Johnson without mentioning that his Gold Medal was taken back!
