





One must not forget his radio program "Melodien aus dem Schwarzwaldhaus" on station CKOC and his participation during "Mardi Gras". He was Prince Carnival during the 1958/59 season and honorary senator of the K.G. Narrhalla 58. Some of you might remember functions with him and the "Theater Gruppe" in the Germania Club of Hamilton. We felt it would be nice to remember Ted with a tree planting in the park. 
