Egon Richard Ueberholz was born in 1933, in Stoeffin, Germany, son of Emma and Friederich. The family wandered to Northern Germany, namely Stade, where Egon met his sweetheart Magdalena Ohle, and in 1955 they were married. In 1956, Egon and Leni were blessed with their daughter, Heidi, and it was not long before Egon was looking



for opportunity in his field, which brought him to Canada as an immigrant. Egon immigrated to Hamilton, Ontario in 1958, and was followed by his family in 1959 when he was established in his field, plumbing and pipe fitting. Egon worked hard to look after his family, and he soon became a foreman, member of UA Local 67.

The desire for the family to value German Heritage brought Egon to the Germania Club of Hamilton in 1962. This way he could keep his German ties, and his daughter could attend German School and ballet. In 1966 the family became complete, Thomas was born, and the family became four.

Egon and Magdalena were frequent visitors at the club, they loved to dance and sing. It was not long before Heidi joined the Garde, so dancing and singing became a regular occurrence, and Egon and Leni frequently attended dances and the "Ein Prosit" show. It was great to be a part of the German Community, enjoy the German Culture, and Egon did work very hard to encourage friends of German descent to become members. Egon enjoyed chess and became an active member of the chess club.

Egon and Magdalena became part of the choir family in 1982. They were dedicated choir members, rarely missing a practice, and enjoying the company and "Kameradschaft" among the choir members.

The Ueberholz family grew when Heidi and Paul Frank were married and Tom and Jeannette Brown were married. Egon is proud Opa to Richard and wife Colleen, Rhiannon, Bronwyn and Jacob, and Uropa to Magdalena, Hannibal and Remington. The family continues to support and be active in the Germania Club, currently there are four generations of the family as members, Egon, his daughter, grandson and great grandchildren. In fact currently Egon's granddaughter Magdalena is going to German School, the same school that his daughter attended so many years ago.

Egon and Magdalena moved to British Columbia in 1993 to retire, but have made frequent trips to Ontario to visit the family. Egon and Leni always make a point of visiting the club and their choir friends when they visit. Congratulations on becoming a 50 year member, Egon, the club appreciates your continued support.



The Camper's Report



October 2nd. Frank On Poyton, esteemed our Chairman, and Ι were summoned to the Germania Clubhouse to negotiate the camping fees for 2013 with the Germania Club's Executive Board.

This proved to be a lengthy difficult undertaking. and The Club asked for the sky (well, almost) and we humbly modest suggested a more increase. After nearly three hours of negotiation, we came to a compromise: an increase of fifty dollars across the board. At the time Frank and thought, that under the Τ circumstances, this was fair and equitable. But, my fellow campers, we all know: "the devil is in the details."

If you are a seasonal camper, on a regular site, you will actually pay, for the site alone, \$ 55.74 more (taxes included), for your second fridge \$ 7.96 more and for air conditioning \$7.96 more. Of course, the Club membership has also gone up: another \$10.00 per family. So add all this up, you will be shelling out \$81.66 more than last year. Now, in all fairness, some charges have been reduced and some were eliminated. Electric lawnmowers attract no extra charges anymore and overnight guests can stay with us on our campsites for free.

So, without further ado, here is the campground fee schedule for 2013 in its entirety:

Regular, seasonal, serviced site: \$ 560.00 Oversized, seasonal, serviced site: \$ 590.00 Lot # 18 through #35 are deemed oversized lots, but not # 32 and # 33. (#32 and #33 have no service.) Campers with RVs 27 feet long or shorter, now occupying these sites, are grandfathered in as "regular." Any change in owner or RV will trigger, on these sites, the "oversized lot" fee Extra fridge: \$40.00 Air conditioning: \$40.00

Non-serviced sites: Tent site per season: \$ 420.00 Tent site per month: \$ 70.00 Tent site per week: \$ 40.00 Tent site per weekend (two nights): \$ 25.00 Tent site per day: \$ 15.00

Before you write that cheque, please remember that the Club's membership fees have



also changed. So while I'm at it, here are the new Germania Club membership fees for 2013: Adult: \$ 70.00 Family: \$ 120.00

- Senior (65+): \$ 50.00
- Student: \$ 17.00
- All payments should be made before March 1st. 2013.

Enough already! On a more pleasant note:

Our Park Manager, Kevin, informed me that he is still removing dead or dying trees, especially along the driveway into the Park. Also, the playground equipment will be moved to higher ground, beside the playhouse. That should get it out of the mud, once and for all. Thank you, Kevin.

Our spring campers' meeting is tentatively scheduled for May 5th, at 1:00 PM at the Pavilion. Once Frank gets back from Texas we may be able to organize a little get together at the same time. I'll get back to that in our April issue.

Dear Visitor

Welcome! You are standing in front of 187 graves of German prisoners of war who died in Canada in thirty-six internment camps during the first and second World Wars. These men were taken prisoners in Europe and shipped to Canada. Some were teenagers and others middle-aged men. They died far away from their homeland, far away from their families and friends. Since they were buried in different locations across Canada, a decision was made to transfer the remains to this location, the Woodland Cemetery in Kitchener, to give the deceased a common resting place. The burial site was dedicated on May 23, 1971 by Professor Willi Thiele and consecrated By Rev. Helmut Pfruefer of the Bethel Lutheran Church and Rev. J. Schmalz. Representatives of the Canadian and German Government, the VDK (Volksbund Deutsche Kriegsgräberfürsorge e.V.), 126 Relatives of the dead soldiers, representatives of many German-Canadian Clubs and individuals from all walks of life attended the inauguration. Since the inauguration, a commemorative service of reflection has taken place annually at this location on the German Day of Remembrance. And as we, the representatives of the German community do on Canadian Remembrance Day, so do representatives of the Canadian Armed Forces place wreaths to pay their last respect and salute the dead German soldiers. No longer as enemies, but as men who lost their life fighting for their country. A noble gesture indeed.

In preparation for the 40th anniversary of the dedication of this Woodland Cemetery site, members and friends of the German Canadian Remembrance Society replaced the wooden crosses after they were damaged by vandalism, poured new footings under the entrance wall, trimmed the trees, cleaned and re-pointed the walkway, cleaned all crosses and repainted all the names and placed wreaths at all the crosses. Willkommen! Vor Dir liegen die Gräber von 187 deutschen Soldaten die in sechsunddreißig kanadischen Lagern als Kriegsgefangene des ersten und zweiten Weltkriegs ihr Leben ließen. Sie gerieten in Europa in Gefangenschaft und wurden nach Kanada abtransportiert. Manche waren noch sehr jung und andere waren Männer im mittleren Alter. Sie starben weit entfernt von ihrer Heimat, von ihren Familien und Freunden. Da sie in verschieden Orten begraben waren, entschied man sich ihre sterblichen Überreste an einen gemeinsamen Ort zu bringen um ihnen dort die letzte Ruhe zu gewähren. Als Platz wurde der Woodland Friedhof in Kitchener gewählt. Diese Stätte wurde am 23. Mai 1971 von Professor Willi Thiele eingeweiht und von den Pastoren Helmut Pruefer und J. Schmalz gesegnet. Vertreter der kanadischen und der deutschen Regierung sowie Repräsentanten des VDK (Volksbund Deutsche Kriegsgräberfürsorge e.V.) nahmen an der Feier teil. Weiter waren Vertreter von vielen Deutschkanadischen Vereinen zugegen und auch 126 Angehörige der Verstorbenen und viele Personen, etwa 2000, die zu diesem Ereignis nach Kitchener kamen. Jedes Jahr findet seitdem eine Feier statt an der auch Angehörige des kanadischen Heeres, der Marine und der Luftwaffe teilnehmen. Und so wie wir, als Vertreter unserer deutschen Gemeinde am kanadischen Remembrance Day, legen auch sie Kränze nieder und gebieten den toten deutschen Soldaten die letzte Ehre. Nicht länger als ehemalige Gegner, sondern als Soldaten die für ihr Land ihr Leben ließen. In der Tat eine edle Geste.

In Vorbereitung auf das 40. Jubiläum der Einweihung dieser Grabstätte haben Mitglieder und Freunde der Deutsch-Kanadischen Gedächtnisstiftung die Holzkreuze ersetzt, nachdem sie durch Brandstiftung geschädigt wurden, ein neues Fundament unter der Mauer am Eingang gegossen, die Bäume beschnitten, den Steinweg gesäubert und verfugt, alle Kreuze gereinigt und alle Namen neu ausgemalt und Kränze an alle Kreuze gelegt.
