The President's Message



This year has been a very trying time for the Club. We have been inundated with a myriad of anonymous complaints both in the Club facilities on King Street and in our Park in Binbrook.

The first complaint was to the City of Hamilton By-Law Department concerning the number of trailers that we had in the park. There is an old Glanbrook By-Law that stated that there was to be no more than 25 trailers in the Park. In 1998 there was a meeting held in September of that year between representatives of the Club, the Conservation Authority and the Town of Glanbrook. At the conclusion of the meeting the Club was granted 32 trailers and 5 tent sites for a total of 37. Unfortunately with amalgamation the paperwork on this has been lost in the shuffle. The result of the complaint was the placing of a moratorium on the number of trailers to be in the park by the Board of Directors.

As if that wasn't enough, the next complaint was to the Electrical Safety Authority concerning the size of wire being used in the Park and the size of the breakers. The inspector could find no fault with this however he did note some infractions such as buried cables from the source outlet to the trailer hookup. Also it was recommended that the minimum cordage used would be 14 gauge but 12 gauge would be The next was exposed preferred. electrical outlets that were not GFCI protected. There were other minor items such as the plastic clamps securing the conduit to the poles were snapped. Almost all items found by the inspector have been rectified.

Due to the freezing of pipes in both





buildings at the Park a serious mold problem was found. This necessitated the closing of the buildings to access by anyone until the mold could be remediated. Luckily for the Club one of the members, Mr. Carlos Andermarchi, is a qualified specialist and after some time was able to give us the green light to access the buildings and make necessary repairs.

Next on Mr/Ms complaint list was a sewage spill that was reported to the City of Hamilton who sent out one of their technicians who even after a complete walk around of the whole Park could find no such spill. This was also reported to the Ministry of the Environment who sent one of their senior inspectors out. This also turned out to be a white herring and a clean bill was received from the MOE in the final inspection report.

The last complaint involved the Fire Department who had two separate anonymous complaints concerning not only King Street but the Park. The complaint at King Street was with regard to our fire system. Obviously the complainant did not know that Hamilton Fire Protection provides the maintenance of our equipment and fire extinguishers at King Street and in fact prior to the Inspector going to the building had done all work with the exception of some equipment that required ordering parts. As for the Park, the complaint was our fire alarm system and other complaints. When the inspector attended at the park the only question he had was the certification of the emergency lighting for the Fisher Hunter Hall. A request has been placed with the Hamilton Fire Protection to have the Certificate issued.

All of these rather frivolous complaints took up major time for members and the Board of Directors.

Even through all of this we have been able to make repairs in the Pavilion which included replacing the ceiling in the hall outside of the washrooms. We have also repaired the washrooms in the Fisher Hunter Hall, replaced the paneling in the hall outside the washrooms as well as a new ceiling in the hall. We have now commenced the repairs and repainting of the Fisher Hunter Hall. With the help of Bill and Nancy McMenemy and Dave Matteson a good supply of wood has been placed inside and outside of the Fisher Hunter Hall for use during the colder weather.

At this time, I would like to thank all of the volunteers who have assisted with the maintenance of the



park facilities by doing maintenance chores, water testing, grass cutting and the many other tasks that pop up at a minute's notice. Although they know who they are but feel that it is important to thank them in a public way. They are Albert Kergl, Vladimir and Julia Khaytin, Dave Matteson, Andre Valente, Carlos Andermarchi, Joe Feduszczak, Dave Blosser, and Bill and Nancy McMenemy. Without their help looking after the park and infrastructure would have been insurmountable.

If you haven't received your vaccine yet, I would encourage you to do so. I hope this short message finds all in good health and remember to stay safe. I wish all members and friends of the Germania Club a Merry Christmas, and all the very best for a Happy and Healthy New Year.
