THE GERMANIA CLUB OF HAMILTON A Brief History By Hans Bastel October 19, 2019

Ladies and Gentlemen,

I am honoured to have been asked to give a short retrospective on 155 years of Germania Club activities. I realize that lectures about history are not everyone's cup of tea on a sunny Saturday afternoon. So, I'll try to keep it relatively short and, hopefully, a bit interesting!

The Germania Club was founded in 1864 as a result of the joint efforts of two groups of German-speakers. The first group consisted mainly of Pennsylvania Germans, also referred to as Pennsylvania Dutch, who had arrived in the Hamilton area between 1790 and 1820. They were mostly Mennonites who spoke "Plattdeutsch", which is a northern German dialect. These Mennonites had left the USA during and after the American War of Independence (1775 to 1783). The Americans didn't like the Mennonites very much because, as pacifists, they refused to take up arms against the British.

[By the way, just as a historical footnote: Their unwillingness to fight in wars was partly responsible for Berlin to be renamed Kitchener during World War 1. A large segment of that city's German-speakers at the time were also Mennonites who refused to join the Canadian armed forces because of their pacifism. (You can read it all in the Kitchener History Museum].

But back to the Hamilton Mennonites: You may not be aware of this, but quite a few streets, schools and churches in the Hamilton area are named after these early German-speakers. For example: Hess, Springer, Burkholder, Betzner, Herkimer and Horning. The same is true for other areas in southern Ontario. Few people know that the city of Markham used to be called Mannheim. Here is another example - in the Archives of Ontario you can still read the following:

The upper region of Ontario is divided, out of consideration for the large German speaking element in the United Empire Loyalists population, into



Lunenburg, Mecklenburg, Hesse and Nassau.

Hamilton was located in the Nassau region. This, of course, changed when Ontario was restructured into counties and Hamilton became part of Wentworth County.

The Mennonites were the first group of German-speakers to arrive here. The second group came from German-speaking areas in Europe between the years 1840 and 1870. There were about a 1,000 of them. Many of them came here because they found themselves on the losing side of Europe's revolutionary wars which ended around 1848. At the time people in Europe tried to get rid of monarchies. They succeeded in France but not in many other places.

Then, in 1855, two catastrophes hit Hamilton hard. Firstly, there was a major cholera epidemic, which affected everyone but especially the immigrant population. Secondly, in the same year, the city of Hamilton went bankrupt and could no longer provide even a minimum of health and social services. Within a two-year period, Hamilton's population shrunk by close to 9000

people from 28,000 to 19,000!

Times were tough. To survive, people had to help each other. That is why the "old" German-speakers from Pennsylvania got together with the new arrivals from Europe to assist each other by establishing a Benevolent Committee. But we know what the Germans like to do when they want to get together for whatever reason: They establish a "Verein", a club. Preferably one where they can drink a beer and, in the old days anyway, sing folk songs. Even better yet, a club where there were not too many ladies around.

So, they established a male choir, a "Männergesangverein". For a number of years choir practices and other get-togethers were held in a hotel at the corner of Hughson and Rebecca street. This didn't get unnoticed in the local press. Listen to what the Hamilton Herald wrote at the time:

Oh, what is the use of blinking and hesitating? Here it is: the choir members like their lager (beer). Having a nice room to sing in, of course they get thirsty. It was awfully annoying to the conductor to miss, now and then, one or more singers who had stepped out for a sip!
