Over a few issues the Germania post is pleased to print a brief history of the Germania club as presented by Hans Bastel. Here is part 2;

THE GERMANIA CLUB OF HAMILTON A Brief History By Hans Bastel October 19, 2019

But their practice room was soon too small and so the choir decided to rent the top floor of a large building at the corner of Main and John street – right across from today's Court House. This was once again noticed by the ever-present Hamilton Herald which published the following report:

Previous to the Free Masons erecting their new hall, now used by them, their quarters were located at the corner of Main and John Street. When the Masons left their hall, the Germans went into the question of ways and means of renting the vacant rooms. In a few weeks, with the aid of money, paint, brushes and artistic skills, the rooms had been renovated. An artist, Hans Wunder, executed fine portraits of noted German authors and composers. A small stage with a few scenes had been introduced, the ceilings and walls were frescoed. When all was finished, the sign was placed on the building reading "Germania Halle", this being surrounded by a gilded lyre.

So much for the newspaper article. This is also the first time the Roman term "Germania" was used as the name for the choir. [The choir members probably had found out that no decent English-speaker could pronounce the word "Männergesangverein"].

Up to now, the club had consisted of a benevolent committee and a male choir. But as soon as they had rented their hall and a few club rooms, they expanded by adding a Saturday afternoon German language school, a theater group, a library, a billiard room and a brass band. And they added ballroom dances - at times up to three times a week!

[Apropos dances: In one of the Club's early minute books there was mention that Tango dances were not allowed on club premises because "tangos were immoral since they made men too heated". It sounds a lot better in its original German: "Dieser Tanz ist unmoralisch weil die Männer für die Frauen zu hitzig werden"].

Having first incorporated in 1871 as a charitable organization, the Club, in 1884, obtained its so-called Royal Charter. With this charter the Club became a corporation with share capital, an "Aktiengesellschaft". Its official name changed to "Germania Club of Hamilton Limited". Many voting members became shareholders. A share cost \$10, approximately \$240 in today's dollars.

Also, with this charter came the right to serve liquor. Quite a feat, considering that the temperance movement throughout North America preached prohibition of alcohol. Until the 1920s the Germania Club was the only private club in Hamilton with a liquor license.

No wonder business started booming, both socially and financially.

Old minute books show that around the turn of the century the monthly income was about \$1,000 and the profit was \$300 (that is about \$24,000 and \$7200 in today's dollars, according to the Bank of Canada inflation tables). Also, no wonder that the Club started thinking about buying its own building. And that is exactly what happened. In 1907 it was decided to buy a large building, which included a bowling alley, on 17 Main Street East, between James and Hughson streets, smack dab in the middle of downtown Hamilton!

The building cost \$50,000, that is about 1.2 million in today's dollars! When that building was sold in 1917, the Club received \$60,000. The remaining mortgage was only \$7,500, the rest had been paid off! That means the Club made a profit of \$52,500 - that is an astounding 1.2 million dollars in today's dollar terms.

We will see later what happened to that money.

According to press reports, minute books and oral histories, it was the "inthing" to be a member of the Germania Club in pre-World War times. If you weren't a shareholder (there were about 100 of those), you could become a non-voting social member. Again, according to press reports, the Club organized huge choir festivals, street parades and other music events. It's fireworks behind Dundurn Castle where given excellent reviews in Hamilton, Toronto and Buffalo newspapers.

All this came to a crushing halt in 1914, when World War I started.
